Memorial Ceremony and Pet Blessing

Each year, we honor the hounds that have made their way across the Rainbow Bridge. This is a very moving moment during the Bash as we pause to recognize their loss. If you have experienced a loss since the 2021 Bash, please let us know by completing the Memorial section on your Bash registration form. Your heavenly hound does NOT have to be a BHRG alum to be remembered. You may also do this in person at the Bash registration table.

Don't Forget

 **Bash Registration form** - Must be received and post-marked by November 6th

Online registration deadline is November 10 (also, you will pay \$25 per person at the door if your registration is post-marked later than 11/6/22 & time-stamped later than 11/10/22)

 **T-shirt pre-order form** - Must be RECEIVED by September 26th so we can have the shirts printed.

 **Vet Services** - Riverside Animal Hospital will be at the Bash to offer **nail trims, microchipping** (BHRG chips all of our foster hounds and we definitely recommend you chip your hounds, too!), & **discount vaccinations** during the Bash this year. Don't forget to bring an extra check or cash to ensure your hounds are protected by annual vaccines as well as the simple technology that can assist you in recovering your beloved hounds if they wander off.



Fosters Are Always Needed

BHRG has been rescuing bassetts of all ages, shapes, sizes, dispositions, and various levels of physical health for 30+ years!! That's right, 30+ years and still going strong. As you may have learned, we will not turn a hound in need away. This is an incredible feat that requires the help of our entire village, a village comprised of fundraisers, donors, liaisons, transporters, vets, fosters, other volunteers, and adopters, amongst a vast network of cheerleaders. Over the years our organization has experienced the highs and lows that come with the risks and rewards of doing what unites us all, our love of this unique breed of low riding, long eared, toddler like, Frito smelling hounds we simply can't live without.

"Life in the trenches is hard, but we choose blood, sweat, and tears. Occasionally hounds come in ready to roll, others have a long road of recovery ahead. Currently, it's raining bassetts! We are taking them in 5 times faster than we are moving them out, and the half truths regarding their lives before BHRG are creating dangerous eddies in the rising floodwaters. Regardless, no matter what the previous circumstance, we believe there are better days ahead."

"Life in the trenches is hard, but we choose blood, sweat, and tears. Young, old, underweight, overweight, healthy, sick, happy, scared, socialized, seemingly feral, athletic, arthritic, pearly whites, in need of multiple extractions, spayed/neutered, intact - even pregnant, up to date, never been vetted, house broken, go where they please, affectionate, afraid, runny poops, runny eyes, cherry eyes, dry eyes, one eyed, docked tails, ripped ears, wonky legs, bad backs, bad skin, bad breath, bad attitudes, bad raps. No matter what the previous circumstance, we believe there are better days ahead."

"Life in the trenches is hard, but we choose blood, sweat, and tears. Some hounds are anemic and infested with fleas, others have insane allergies. Some have lived into double digits and their owners have passed, others have been bounced around to 4 different families in 3 years. Some have never laid foot inside a home, and others have never laid foot outside of a cage. Some have never felt a gentle hand, others have never had a regular meal. Some love other canines and don't trust humans. Others love only humans and not other canines. Some are undeniably good looking, others aren't as easy on the eyes. Some are super sweet, some are quite smart, others have a screw loose, or have to rely on charm alone. No matter what the previous circumstance, we believe there are better days ahead."

"Life in the trenches is hard, but we choose blood, sweat, and tears. Many are successfully rehabilitated in a few short weeks, others take months, even years, to get situated in their new normal. Some leave our care as youngsters and are welcomed back into the fold as seniors. A few don't make it, but do experience love in their final hours before crossing the rainbow bridge. No matter what the previous circumstance, we believe there are better days ahead."

"Life in the trenches is hard, but we choose blood, sweat, and tears. None of these hounds have chosen the road to rescue, but we have chosen to make this the road of least resistance for them. We arrange intake, transportation, continued veterinary appointments, visits at the kennel, foster and forever families. We invest our time, patience, and sanity for the cause. We are oftentimes misunderstood and ridiculed, but many times celebrated and revered. Just when we think we've heard or seen it all, and we're ready to hang it up for a much less complicated and stressful life, we are reminded of the value of our persistence, our willingness to keep putting one foot in front of the other no matter how challenging, and our ability to unite wagging tails and smiling faces. No matter what the previous circumstance, we know there are better days ahead."

Whether you prefer young or old, healthy or sick, active or more sedentary, we do our best to match our fosters with the right hound much like we do with forever families because we want the experience to be a success for all parties involved. If you foster a hound you realize you simply cannot send on to another family, foster adoption is ok too! Fosters are always needed, even if only to be on-call for when that blind senior who doesn't need steps to contend with, or that wild 2 yr old that refuses to stop being a puppy, or that hound that needs a home without any other fur babies, or even the hound that needs the support of a well-functioning pack. We never know what type of hound(s) will come in from our amazing intake network, and we will not turn any of them away. The kennel is a lovely facility but can still be quite stressful for the hounds, and doesn't really provide the level of observation required to answer the questions many of our potential adopters have. We need all of the compassionate, patient, and courageous folks we can get in order to cat test, nurse back to health, socialize, potty train, and simply love these hounds that deserve a second chance for happily ever after.



Foster Humans...We NEED You!

Won't you consider becoming a Foster Home to one of the many we have in our care? As you know, BHRG has never turned down a Basset in the state of Georgia. If we don't have a home for them to go to, they have to live in our kennel until they get adopted or a foster home opens up. YOU can make a difference in their life if you open up your heart and home and help that hound know the love and comfort they deserve! Here's where to start:

-  How does it work? Our AMAZING Foster Coordinator, Whitney Harper, will contact you after receiving your application and chat about your home and lifestyle. She knows our hounds best and can match one that will fit in with your family.
-  Do I have to pay for stuff? NO! All vetting, heartworm, and flea preventatives are paid for by the rescue. You may though, from time to time, have to take your foster hound to an approved BHRG vet appointment while they live with you, but that is taken care of by BHRG.
-  What do I have to do? Foster homes have to provide for their foster hound's daily needs, food, shelter, a safe yard to play in. Guidance, manners, potty training, and leash training are all skills you may need to work on with your foster hound. Until your foster hound is adopted, we also ask that you bring them to one adoption event per month so they can meet prospective families who are ready to adopt. See, it's that easy!

Spring Fling 2022 - Our Mission Was Pawsible

Many thanks to all of the volunteers, donors, & those who attended the 2022 Spring Fling held on April 30, 2022 at The Reid Barn. This year's theme was **Mission: Impawsible** & many of our basset heroes along with their hounds were represented in our video. This year the event missed its target of \$75,000, raising right at **\$66,000** after expenses (many factors were beyond our control) Wendy Miller was our auctioneer, and Julie Hall served as our Hostess/MC. She kept things running smoothly. Sixty plus attendees played Heads or Tails with the winner Chuck Grissom walking away with half the pot of \$515, which he generously donated back to BHRG. Over 150 people were part of the Spring Fling's fundraising efforts. Thank you to all who participated purchasing t-shirts, participated in the quilt raffle, bidding/donating in the live & silent auction, donated during our Mission Moment, and sponsored the event. For those of you who couldn't join us here's a few extra highlights and notes:

Mission: Impawsible

We Celebrated Our Extra Special Volunteers

Doc has been with BHRG since he adopted his first basset, Bones, from us in 2006, and has adopted probably close to a dozen more since then. Shortly after that, he began his "transport" service. He never says "no" – he just goes. **Doesn't matter how far, when, or where – he's always on board.** BHRG wouldn't be able to function without him. He is a retired from the Armed Forces, so he has plenty of free time on his hands. Doc currently has three basset girls – Cupcake, Nelda Bell, and Hazel. Cupcake and Nelda Bell are BHRG Alumni, and Hazel was a privately owned girl that Doc adopted on his own. Before these girls, a large number of bassets have passed thru his door. Thank you Doc for being such a dedicated volunteer. Your award was well deserved!

Sometimes he gets a little too friendly trying to hump his playmates, but is a quick learner so a firm but kind canine companion would be ideal.

He has finally been examined by a specialist for his skin issues & a new treatment plan is underway. He has some quirks with certain people & shoes/boots coming toward him, & would fare best in a home with no small children. ✂️ **Charles** is a 4 yr old who came from a backyard breeder. He likes to mark EVERYTHING, & is not housebroken due to living outside.
